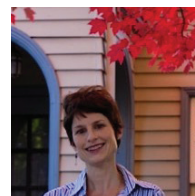
CRAIG LESLEY

Lesley has received fellowships from the National Endowment for the Arts, RACC, Bread Loaf, two National Endowment for the Arts awards and the Oregon Coast Literary Award for Best Novel about small town Oregon.
